Spetchley Park was built for Robert Berkeley between the years 1811-18 to the designs of John Tasker. It consists of the mansion house oriented east west with principal elevation facing south over the lakes and deer park. To the rear (N) is the service courtyard and service ranges.

The mansion is built in honey coloured Bath stone ashlar and the service ranges in brick. The house has been in continuous occupation by the Berkeley family and remains in an almost untouched state.

We carried out a condition survey of the dwelling in 2011 and identified essential repairs to slate roof coverings and leadwork and to stonework which had suffered from frost damage and from rusty iron cramps.

We have now completed three phases of repairs at the dwelling including the rebuilding of all the chimney stacks to the mansion, re-leading of parapet and valley gutters and re-covering of selected roof slopes.
