St. George's Church, Barbourne, Worcester was completed in 1895. It was one of the first commissions for a new church by the architect Sir Aston Webb and is generally regarded as one of his finest. Designed in the Arts and Crafts style, it is superbly detailed using a soft red brick with bandings of limestone and uses Westmorland slates for the roof coverings - a favoured roofing material of this style.

We completed two phases of roof repairs at the church during which the roof coverings were completely stripped and relaid reusing reclaimed slates for 50% of the roof and new Westmorland slates elsewhere. The lead valleys and parapet gutters were renewed and the decorative cast iron rainwater goods were recast to the same pattern as originally.
