St. James' Church is a large stone built church erected in 1875.

The church was a multi use community building, used for the traditional Sunday worship and also open during the week for local bring and buy sales.

The PCC wanted to expand the community use but the building lacked the essential facilities such as toilets and a kitchen, and disabled access.

In 2010 the PCC appointed Nick Joyce Architects LLP to assist them in achieving their vision for the building.

We produced a scheme which provided both fixed facilities such as toilets, kitchen, meeting rooms and a vestry, as well as more flexible storage and meeting spaces using removable screens. The baptismal font was also re-located.
